

Graduate Assistantship Opportunities in Agricultural and Human Sciences at NC State University

Graduate student assistantship positions are available in the Department of Agricultural and Human Sciences. Positions will begin fall 2022, and will provide tuition, a stipend, and health insurance. We anticipate that funding will be available for 3 years for doctoral students and 2 years for master's students.

Graduate Assistant: Communications (Academic and Research)

This assistantship will be to teach and grade one face-to-face (Fall) and two online sections (Fall/Spring) of AEE 311: Communication Methods and Media in Agricultural & Life Sciences and to assist with AEE 350: Personal Leadership Development in Agricultural & Life Sciences (Spring). The successful candidate will have undergraduate course work in either leadership or communications and a strong desire to hone their teaching skills. The successful candidate will have the opportunity to engage in scholarship of teaching and learning research related to these courses as well. This 2- or 3-year assistantship will begin fall 2022. The applicant should be pursuing an on-campus graduate degree in the Department of Agricultural and Human Sciences.
